CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Sears at 6:55 p.m. A quorum was present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice Chairperson Stewart.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Commissioner Hall.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

It was moved by Commissioner Vaughan and seconded by Commissioner Hall that the minutes of the March 12, 2014, meeting be approved. The motion carried.

COMMISSION ADVISOR REPORTS

Mr. Falkow advised the CPOC that the City is still in negotiations with three of the bargaining groups. He stated that the Memorandums of Understanding were finalized with the Police Management Group. The Police Management Group will take their contract to their membership to vote. Mr. Falkow stated that he will take three MOUs and a salary ordinance to the City Council for adoption. He further said he hoped to have it agendized the end of April or early May.

Mr. Falkow stated that the City had a tentative agreement with the leadership of the Service Employees International Union (SEIU). He further stated that the SEIU leadership took it to a vote, and it was rejected. Mr. Falkow stated that the City is in full impasse with SEIU. The City had its first session of state mediation today with the state mediator. Mr. Falkow further stated that there may be one more good faith session and after that it probably will go to fact finding.

Mr. Falkow stated that the Inglewood Management Employee Organization and the Inglewood Police Civilian Management Association are at impasse and have exhausted the state mediation however, they have given the City a proposal. Mr. Falkow stated that he met with City Council last night in closed session and was given direction. He stated that it is likely that the City will be going to fact finding with those two groups as well.

Mr. Falkow announced that the Mayor's State of the City Address is scheduled for tomorrow, April 10, 2014, at the Forum. He stated that it is expected to be a large turnout with a minimum of four hundred people in attendance.

Mr. Falkow advised the CPOC that he has spoken with the Chief of Police, and there will be a tour this evening of the police department. He stated that Commissioners cannot speak about anything that is CPOC related because the CPOC meeting will be adjourned.

Chairperson Sears stated that the reason for the tour of the police department is for the Commissioners to have a better understanding of the different bureaus, so when cases are reviewed, commissioners will know the process.

Mr. Falkow stated that the Police Chief will have a Police Captain provide to the CPOC a copy of the police department's training schedule that allows non law enforcement to attend.

CLOSED SESSION

There was no closed session held.

CLOSED SESSION REPORT OUT

There was no closed session report out.

STAFF REMARKS

There were no staff remarks.

COMMISSION MEMBERS REMARK

Commissioner Vaughan wished everyone a Happy Easter.

Chairperson Sears thanked staff for coordinating the police tour. Chairperson Sears commented that the CPOC would like to get the police training on the schedule as soon as possible since the year is almost over.
