## TREE TRIMMING SCHEDULE

The City takes great pride in its tree maintenance operation. The main objective is to address citizens' needs for tree care and to maintain urban forestry consistent with the highest professional standards and optimum regularity to ensure City trees remain healthy, aesthetically pleasing and safe for both the motoring and pedestrian public.

Currently, City crews are assigned to trim fully canopied trees (Ficus/Chinese Elms) that require annual trimming.

City crews will continue to handle special requests in the respective districts, with attention given to each Council district. City crews will also continue to concentrate their efforts on the removal of dead or diseased trees throughout the City and tree trimming at City parks and facilities.

### **December 2009**

- West 81<sup>st</sup> Street from 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue (12-07 through 12-15)
- West 82<sup>nd</sup> Place from 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 80<sup>th</sup> Street (12-16 through 12-23)
- Special Requests (12-28 through 12-30)

### **January 2010**

- East Hillsdale Street From Field Avenue to North Welton Way (1-04 through 1-12)
- East Brett Street from Field Avenue to North Welton Way (1-13 through 1-22).
- Special Requests (1-25 through 1-28)

### **February 2010**

- South Maple Avenue from East Arbor Vitae Street to West Century Blvd (2-01 through 2-09)
- South Grevillea Avenue from East Arbor Vitae Street to West Century Blvd (2-10 through 2-19)
- Special Requests (2-22 through 2-25)

The above Tree Trimming Schedule is followed as closely as possible. However, changes may occur or deviations from the list may happen due to emergencies, potentially hazardous situations, or when equipment breakdowns occur.

**Note: All citizen generated special requests are handled the last week of each month.**
