The City of Inglewood Planning Commission will hold a public meeting to consider the City's General Plan Update process at:

You are encouraged to attend the meeting and to share your opinions on the future direction of the City. At this meeting interested parties can provide the City with their input on the content and analysis conducted for the General Plan Land Use Alternatives. Your opinions and participation are vital if the City is to develop a General Plan that reflects the goals of the community. Meeting facilities are accessible to persons with disabilities. You may also send written comments to the Inglewood Planning Division, One Manchester Boulevard, Inglewood, CA 90312.

The General Plan is a legal document that serves as the City's "blue print" for the use of land within its boundaries. It provides the basis for the City's zoning and subdivision regulations, and informs residents, developers, and decision-makers of the ground rules that guide development. The current General Plan was last revised in 1980, and the City is required by law to update the plan for the future. State law requires the Plan to address at least seven "elements" or topic areas. These topics are land use, circulation, housing, open space, conservation, safety, and noise.

On September 8th and 12th, two community workshops were conducted to allow for a discussion of preliminary land use alternatives. The results of those two meetings will be discussed during the October 17th meeting. The meeting will include a progress report on the Plan Update, answers to questions asked at the September 8th and 12th Community Workshops and a discussion of key land use alternative planning and development issues in the City of Inglewood led by the City's Planning Commissioners.

The community workshops and Planning Commission recommendation(s) will be forwarded to the City Council for future consideration. The discussions conducted during the community workshops and during Planning Commission and City Council meetings may provide the basis for new or revised General Plan policies on topics such as land use, transportation, and open space. Members of the public will have an opportunity to be heard during each scheduled meeting.
