Safety Begins With Me : Metro Bus Safety—Never run after or next to the bus. Metro Rail Safety—Never use train tracks as a shortcut.

Try the Artesia Transit Center—Weekdays between 6 and 9 a.m. there's a bus heading north to downtown Los Angeles every 8-10 minutes from this Metro facility, which provides convenient transfers between buses. The trip downtown takes only 40 minutes from the center located just east of the S. Vermont Avenue and 182nd Street intersection. It's free parking— 900 spaces at the center where bus service operates from 5 a.m. to midnight. The following Metro bus lines service this location —52, 130, 205, 214, 352, 444, 445, 446, 447, 550 and the Torrance T1 and T6.
