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APRIL 2022 MEETING MINUTES

1. Roll Call

- A. A meeting was held at the City of Inglewood located on the 1st Floor in Conference Room A at 7:05 pm.
- B. Commissioner Charles Braggs, District 1, served as interim chairman until further notice.
- C. Prior to the beginning of the Meeting of the Parking and Traffic Commission, the Councilman Alex Padilla, announced the departure of the Commissioner, Leonel García; and recognized the District 2 Traffic and Parking Commissioner for the wonderful six years of service and trust provided to the community and the City. Councilman Alex Padilla presented recognition for achievements and wished Commissioner Leonel García the best in his new endeavor.

2. Approval of Minutes

- A. Approval of Minutes for March 2022
 - a) Commissioner Leonel Garcia made a motion to accept the meeting notes.
 - b) Seconded by Commissioner Brett C.S. Roberts.
 - c) Three of the members present approved the meeting minutes

3. Public Comments

- A. The 118th Street resident asked about the District 4 Commissioner replacement. Also, the resident stated that the Residential Permit Parking District No. 11 should be inactive based on distance to the Enterterment District. Lastly, it was asked if the resident can revert to the Residential Permit Parking after the termination and modification process. Public Works staff provided updates on the Commissioner's Replacement and explained the active and inactive locations, as well as the modification and termination of the Residential Permit Parking Program process.

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- B. An Oak Street Resident requested more support and action from the District Councilman, Eloy Morales to support the rights of the residents. In addition, the resident requests an extension not to implement the Residential Parking Permit in Council District No. 3.
- C. A resident of Council District No. 3 stated that the community is approximately 80% Hispanic and does not understand the rules and regulations of the Residential Parking Permit District. The resident is concerned about housing parking due to the year the houses were built and the new parking situation is not easy to meet. In addition, the resident requested an extension not to implement the Residential Parking Permit in Council District No. 3.
- D. A resident of Council District No. 3 said that the Residential Parking Permit Program is not easy to understand. The program prevents visitors or special events from being held at residents' homes. Lastly, the resident asked about a better plan to better compensate the resident. Resident is against the Residential Parking Permit Program.

 - c) To approve the application, a minimum of seventy-five percent (75%) is required.
 - d) Parking and Transit Commission disapproved the request to modify the Citywide Parking Permit Program for 108th Street between Crenshaw Boulevard and Van Ness Avenue.
