Caller (Name Unknown) commented on Warrants and Bills, and Brown Act violations by not allowing ample time to speak on Agenda Items.

Caller (Name Unknown) spoke regarding problems with the audio when she calls, and hoped the Community Room would open soon to ensure their voices are being heard.

Caller (Name Unknown) spoke regarding the unhoused community that's living off the 105 Freeway entrance. He also spoke regarding the housing that was offered to the unhoused residents and requested the City Council to step in and help.

Mayor Butts stated the on/off ramps belong to the State, and Caltrans came out and orchestrated the cleanup. Caltrans worked with the resources that were made available to them.

Curtis (Last Name Unknown) spoke regarding the unhoused community stating he volunteered with 4 of his staff members to help clean up on numerous occasions. He also addressed problems he's having with some of the Council Members.

Gil Mathieu, District 4, spoke concerning the City Charter and requested that the City Council bring back Code Enforcement. He also addressed equipping the Police with cameras.

Rick Ford, Lennox/Inglewood Tenant Union, commented on the trash near the 105 Freeway entrance and stated the garbage was still there when he went by this morning. He also spoke about the garbage not being picked up by Caltrans or any other agency, and the unhoused residents were promised temporary housing if they picked it up.

The City Clerk, Aisha L. Thompson, read comments that were received via email from Christian Lucas, Ace Di, and Melissa Mateo.

Cinder Eller, Senior Community Affairs Liaison, spoke concerning the unhoused community living on the 105 Freeway exit. She stated the unhoused community was offered services from LAHSA, Saint Joseph's, and Saint Margaret's, but they refused the services.

There being no further business to be presented, Mayor Butts declared the meeting adjourned in memory of Ramiro Centeno, a family member of Council Member Padilla, and Mary Reese Boiken, a teacher at Inglewood Unified School District, at the hour of 2:57 p.m.
