The City Council of the City of Inglewood, California held a regular meeting on Tuesday, January 4, 2022, in the Council Chambers in City Hall of said City.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of our Country, Mayor Butts called the City Council/Successor Agency/Housing Authority into session at the hour of 2:01 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENTS. Mayor/Successor Agency Chairman/Housing Authority Chairman Butts inquired if there were any persons present who wished to address the City Council/Successor Agency/Housing Authority on any item other than the public hearing.

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PAYMENT OF WARRANTS AND BILLS. 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PUBLIC HEARING HELD – ORDINANCE NO. 22-04 INTRODUCED –DESIGNATING CERTAIN PORTIONS OF THE CITY AS AN “EVENT ZONE” TO REGULATE CERTAIN ACTIVITIES IN CONNECTION WITH SUPER BOWL LVI AND RELATED EVENTS. The City Clerk announced that the next scheduled matter was a public hearing to consider an ordinance designating certain portions of the City as an “Event Zone” in order to regulate certain activities in connection with Super Bowl LVI and related events, that notice was given in the time, form and manner as required by law, an affidavit was on file, and communications were received, and distributed to the Mayor and City Council Members.

Mayor Butts ordered the communications received and filed.

Louis Atwell, Assistant City Manager/Public Works Director presented the Staff Report dated January 4, 2022.

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Christopher Jackson, Sr., Economic and Community Development Director, gave a brief presentation.

REPORTS – CITY MANAGER. The City Manager, Artie Fields, wished everyone a Happy New Year. He informed residents that because of the rise of COVID-19, Omicron variant, City Hall was taking additional precautions to keep city employees, visitors, and the community safe. Effective Wednesday, January 5, 2022, all on-site payments for utilities, business taxes, and parking tickets will no longer be accepted at the walk-up window. Payments can be made by mail-in or by dropping them in the drop-box outside the building. He also provided a telephone number for residents who wished to make utility payments by telephone. Finally, he stated anyone who visits City Hall for approved appointments must show proof of vaccination, card or electronic, and a picture identification for access to the building.
