Caller (Name Unknown) question why the fourth map worked best for Inglewood.

Darrell Goode, Branch President of Santa Monica’s NAACP, disagreed with the redistricting process. He stated there were concerns and complaints because the residents weren’t properly notified. He also stated the community would like to get involved, and he intended to contact someone regarding the redistricting of the City.

Kelli Clift, spoke concerning a settlement from being a victims of crime at the Regent Hotel on La Brea. She stated because of the redistricting process she would like to receive a settlement, and housing.

4. Introduction of an Ordinance approving Zone Code Amendment No. 2022-001 (ZCA- 2022-001) to make modifications to Chapter 12 of the Inglewood Municipal Code (Planning and Zoning) related to the Inglewood Transit Connector Project; and
5. Adoption of a Resolution adopting the Design Standards and Guidelines for the Inglewood Transit Connector Project.

Mayor Butts ordered the public hearing set for April 5, 2022, at 2:00 p.m.

**REPORTS - CITY CLERK.** City Clerk, Aisha L. Thompson reported that she was honored to be tasked with redistricting the City of Inglewood. Despite not knowing what the process entailed, she was grateful to be granted the opportunity. She thanked everyone that played a part in assisting her in redistricting process, including Doug Johnson, President of National Demographics Corporation. Residents were reminded about the Special Primary Election for State Assembly 62<sup>nd</sup> District and informed about drop box locations. She closed out National Women’s History Month with a quote from



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Condoleezza Rice. Finally, she asked that the City Council Meeting be closed in honor of her great-nephew General Sema’j Ogleby.

**PUBLIC REMARKS.** Mayor Butts inquired if there were any persons present who wished to address the City Council on any matter connected with City business not elsewhere considered on the Agenda.

Speaker (Name Unknown) spoke concerning the Council not being in compliance with AB 361, the Brown Act, and the FAIR MAPS Act. She also addressed the technical difficulties that were encountered during the March 1, 2022, City Council Meeting. Additionally, she wanted to know the Council’s plan if there was an impending technical disruption. Finally, she requested a list of ways for the public to participate in Council meetings.

There being no further business to be presented, Mayor Butts declared the meeting adjourned in memory of Eric Gabo, Santa Monica Police Officer, Martin Zurla, and General Sema’j Ogleby, great nephew of the City Clerk, Aisha L. Thompson, at the hour of 2:38 p.m.
