Commissioner and RSI Staff Introductions

Residential Sound Insulation Status/Verbal Report by Diana Johnson

- Door Hanger Walk Event Status - Districts 3 and 4
 - Councilmember Faulk along with her assistant Ms. Penix joined the walk
 - Next Walk Event will be scheduled in May 18, 2021
 - A contract consisting of 50 residential units will be presented to the Mayor and City Council for award of contract
 - Milgard will be discontinuing their Quietline windows
 - Program is currently searching for other manufacturers
- We have two groups in plan check totaling 190 residential units
- Commission needs to nominate a Chairperson for LAWA's Roundtable so that they can obtain firsthand knowledge about various things happening at the airport.

Commissioner's Questions/Comments

Commissioner Rudd

- Are these numbers high or low?
Response – numbers are lower than usual, in 2015 we completed 2000 plus units. We have slowed down due to COVID but we plan on tripling our current numbers.

Commissioner Burnett

- What is the status on my neighbor's property?
Response – appointments are being scheduled daily, if a homeowner reaches out to us in hopes of scheduling appointments; we are ready to schedule same day appointments

Commissioner Rudd

- Were the people hesitant when we knocked on doors with door hangers?
Response – not necessarily but we did encounter some homeowners who believed that we were affiliated with a 3rd party company that puts liens on properties. Once we identified ourselves as City Staff it was easier to communicate what the Program has to offer

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- Do we have a deadline?
Response – we have given them a 2 week deadline in hopes that we can obtain immediate response, although as long as we have the funds they will continue to be eligible. Our hopes are to get homeowners involved now.
- Do we follow up with homeowners?
Response – Yes, we reach out to them at least 3 times a year. Prior to COVID we would attend Block Club meetings, hold Super Saturday events, etc. We also have staff who are notaries attend so that we could get homeowners to sign off on the spot.

Commissioner Nicholson

- There has been an increase in parking and parking permits are being assigned, how is that going to affect the City and its hospitality?
Response – we have heard that it was caused somewhat of a stir; as of yet it has not affected our Program or the way that we obtain parking permits while in construction
- It seems like a double edged sword, they gave the o.k. to build all these multi family buildings and there is not adequate parking; this will create PR problems

Commissioner Richardson

- When a building is built they must allocate parking for all units

Commissioner Rudd

- The residential parking permits will prevent people from parking in the neighborhoods during events

Commissioner – Nicholson

- Are City employees tested?
Response – yes, we are being tested every two weeks

Commissioner Rudd

- Is the City requiring the employees to be vaccinated?
Response – as of yet we are not being required to get the vaccine
