183 **PUBLIC HEARING HELD – ORDINANCE NO. 18-06 INTRODUCED – AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE INGLEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE TO BAN OR RESTRICT THE PARKING OF OVERSIZED VEHICLES.** The City Clerk announced that the next scheduled matter is a public hearing to consider an ordinance amending Chapter 3 of the Inglewood Municipal Code to ban or restrict the parking of oversized vehicles on certain city streets and/or during certain hours of the day, that notice has been given in the time form and manner as required by law and that no communications have been received.

Artie Fields, City Manager, presented the staff report dated May 1, 2018.

Mayor Butts ordered the report receive and filed.

Mario Inga, Senior Program Specialist, Parking and Enterprise Services Department, gave a brief overview.

Mayor Butts inquired if there were any persons present that wished to address the City Council on this matter.

Jim Vaughn, 2nd District, commented he is in favor of this Ordinance.

178 **PURCHASE APPROVED – TWO (2) VAPOR WAKE TRAINED CANINES AND CANINE HANDLER TRAINING.** Staff report dated May 1, 2018, was presented recommending approval to purchase two (2) Vapor Wake trained canines and canine handler training.

It was moved by Council Member Franklin, and seconded by Council Member Morales that the City Council does hereby 1) Authorize the issuance of a purchase order to Vapor Wake Technology in the amount of \$100,000; and 2) Approve the use of additional funds required for travel related to the aforementioned training in an amount not to exceed \$25,808. The motion was carried by the following roll call vote:
