Boyd Rodgers spoke concerning the budget presentation and thanked Council Member Gray for the questions she asked regarding the presentation. The speaker complained about paying taxes and not having parking permits. Finally, he suggested evening City Council meetings so working people could come and have their voices heard.

Patrice Reyno, Victims Advocate Representative, spoke representing Maria Pineda, mother of Jose Samuel Galvez Pineda, who was tragically killed while driving his motorcycle. The representative stated that a reward was offered and requested a press release from the City.

Sordis Mora spoke concerning the officer-involved shooting of Ivan Mora. She thanked the City Council for allowing the family to attend the meeting. She stated it was a sad day and wanted accountability for the Police Officers. Finally, she stated she wanted the Council to know about the situation.

Petra Mora, mother of Ivan Mora, spoke in Spanish concerning her son’s illness and the officer’s knowledge of his problem. She asked what good officers were if they didn’t help. Finally, she mentioned trained officers, but untrained officers were sent, which Christine Padilla translated.

Sandra Vilar, spoke concerning the death of Ivan Mora in Spanish, which was translated by Christine Padilla.

Cliff Smith spoke concerning the Police Officers not being equipped with body cameras. He mentioned families of officer-involved shootings and stated it would be cost-efficient to identify the officers involved. Finally, he mentioned a march for justice for Ivan Mora on Sunday, October 1, 2023, at 10:00 a.m. in front of the Inglewood Police Department.

September 26, 2023

Brandon Myer, Inglewood Unified School Board Member, expressed his condolences to Ivan Mora's family for their loss. He wished everyone a Happy Hispanic Heritage Month and mentioned that everyone could celebrate and have a joyous time. He also noted that the Inglewood Unified School District was rising and provided updates, including Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS). Mr. Myers mentioned the Inglewood Unified College Fair on October 2, 2023, from 4 p.m.-7 p.m., where 6,938 students were enrolled. He stated that students would leave after four years with at least the completion of two years of college education and credits. He advised the community to share with neighboring schools, as they need tutors, after-school support, and people to join the Parent Teacher Association (PTA).

Additionally, he encouraged the public to support and attend all committees and school board meetings because the community's voice is valuable. Finally, he discussed Dr.

Williams, Chief Business Officer, and Dr. Morris, County Administrator, attendance at the Fiscal Crisis and Management Assistance Team's (FCMAT) interview. He received passing grades, so the Inglewood Unified School District is emerging from receivership. He ended with the district's statement, "We are Inglewood."

There being no further business to be presented, Mayor Butts declared the meeting adjourned in the honor of Rhonda "Zumba Ronnie" Davis, aunt of Halimah Ginyard, at the hour of 2:49 p.m.
