Cyber volunteers must have some experience using Windows computers, as well as interest in learning new programs. They will also need patience and a positive attitude.

Program Volunteers

These are volunteers who assist with specific library programs, such as movie screenings, special performances, storytimes, puppet shows, chess clubs, arts and crafts, and Summer Reading Program activities.

Reading Partners

Reading Partners are volunteers who read to children. They also allow children to practice reading aloud to them. Reading Partners must have clear reading voices, and be able to listen patiently as children read.

Library Aides

These volunteers assist librarians with various behind-the-scenes tasks, such as creating book displays, keeping the children's play area clean, and re-shelving books.
