

SUPER BOWL LVI FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Will traffic conditions worsen on game day?

A: Traffic conditions on Super Bowl LVI game day are expected to be similar or better than traffic conditions on regular game days at SoFi Stadium.

Traffic trends surrounding the Super Bowl are traditionally very different from regular large-capacity entertainment events. A significant number of Super Bowl ticket holders attend as part of a corporate-sponsored groups. These groups are transported to the event on large chartered buses, many of which are hired by the National Football League (NFL) to transport ticket holders. As a result, there will be fewer individual vehicles traveling to the area and requiring parking accommodations.

Q: What streets will be closed?

A: The following street closures are currently scheduled to take place:

Q: Why are streets being closed?

A: Minimal street closures are required to expedite traffic flow and allow for quick rideshare drop off. These closures will be in effect for a short duration, and are intended to minimize traffic overflow into surrounding neighborhoods.

Q: Will rideshare be available?

A: Yes. There will be designated rideshare drop off and pick up points, with ample signage in place. The **taxi** and **rideshare** pick up and drop off is located on **Kareem Court** just north of the stadium. Taxis and rideshare vehicles will approach the Kareem Court drop off and pick up location, via westbound Pincay Ave.

Q: Will LAZ Parking and iPark&Go be operational on Super Bowl Game Day?

Yes, LAZ Parking and the iPark&Go remote parking and shuttle service will continue to operate as usual. More information can be found by visiting www.cityofinglewood.org/superbowl

Q: Will Metro be operational on Super Bowl game day?

Yes. You can get to to SoFi Stadium via Metro by connecting to the SoFi Stadium Shuttle at the C Line (Green) Hawthorne/Lennox Station. The express shuttle will operate between the

Hawthorne/Lennox Station and SoFi Stadium beginning at 11am through kickoff. Return service will run for 90 minutes after the game concludes. The SoFi Stadium Shuttle is free, but fares apply for regular Metro Bus and Rail service and parking fees at Metro Park & Ride lots. Q: How will nearby residents be impacted?

A: Residents are advised to avoid the area surrounding SoFi Stadium, and to plan alternate routes to avoid street closures. However, overall impact to nearby residents will be minimal. The City of Inglewood and the NFL have developed a comprehensive traffic mitigation plan that will greatly ease congestion in the areas surrounding SoFi Stadium.

Q: What should Inglewood residents do if Super Bowl attendees are parking in permit-parking only areas on residential streets?

A: Residents should call (310) 412-5398 for all parking and traffic related concerns.

Q: Will people be allowed to congregate in the area surrounding the stadium to watch the game?

A: No. There is no way to view the game from outside SoFi Stadium, and no external events are permitted in the area surrounding the stadium. Members of the general public who do not have tickets to the Super Bowl event(s) are highly discouraged from traveling to the area surrounding SoFi Stadium on event days. Loitering will not be permitted, and enforcement will be in place to ensure that the surrounding areas remain clear.

Q: Is the City of Inglewood prepared to manage Super Bowl LVI?

A: Yes, the City of Inglewood has worked with SoFi Stadium leadership and the NFL to develop a thorough traffic mitigation plan for Super Bowl LVI. In addition to the minimal street and lane closures, the City has developed a series of neighborhood protection efforts to ensure that the impact to surrounding areas will be minimal.

The City and the NFL aim to ensure that the Super Bowl LVI is a positive experience for fans, nearby residents, business owners, and other stakeholders.
