**CITY OF INGLEWOOD ANNOUNCES SUPER BOWL LVI STREET CLOSURES AND TRAFFIC ADVISORY**

**INGLEWOOD** - The City of Inglewood has released a list of street closures that will be in effect the week of the Super Bowl LVI. The Super Bowl LVI will be hosted at SoFi Stadium on Sunday, February 13th, 2022. Street closures will be minimal, and serve to expedite traffic to and from SoFi stadium while minimizing impact to the surrounding neighborhoods.

The City of Inglewood has worked hand in hand with Sofi Stadium and the NFL Super Bowl Host Committee in an effort to maximize the fan experience all while minimizing neighborhood disruption. Inglewood Police Department has led the city's comprehensive planning efforts for this historic day in coordination with various city, county, and state agencies.

"This is the first time the Super Bowl has ever been held in the City of Inglewood, and we are thrilled for the opportunity to feature our beloved City on a global stage," Mayor James T. Butts said. "We have been laser focused on making sure this event is a positive experience for residents and stakeholders alike. Hosting a premier event like the Super Bowl is an honor, and one that we are well prepared for. You can be sure that the spirit of Inglewood will be center stage."

A significant number of Super Bowl ticket holders will travel to the event in high-occupancy shuttles as opposed to individual vehicles. As a result, vehicle volume is anticipated to be lower than it is during regularly-scheduled events at SoFi Stadium.

Transit Service, LAZ Parking, IPark&Go remote parking, and other shuttle services will continue to operate as usual. Additionally, dedicated lanes and drop off points will be available for rideshare services. Members of the general public who do not have tickets to the Super Bowl event(s) are highly discouraged from traveling to the area surrounding SoFi Stadium on event days. Loitering will not be permitted, and enforcement will be in place to ensure that the surrounding areas remain clear. To ensure that the impact to surrounding neighborhoods remains minimal, the City of Inglewood has put into place a series of neighborhood protection efforts. Permit parking restrictions will be strongly enforced.

Minimal street and lane closures will be in place surrounding SoFi Stadium from February 10th through February 14th, 2022. Residents can expect to see traffic conditions similar to regular game days surrounding SoFi Stadium.
