National and Chapter History

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is a private, non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established programs in local communities throughout the world. A sisterhood of more than 250,000 predominantly Black college educated women, the Sorority currently has over 1,000 chapters located in the U.S., England, Japan (Tokyo and Okinawa), Germany, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, the Bahamas and the Republic of Korea. The major programs of the sorority are based upon the organization's Five Point Programmatic Thrust:

- Economic Development
- Educational Development
- International Awareness and Involvement
- Physical and Mental Health
- Political Awareness and Involvement

The Sorority, founded in 1913 by 22 students at Howard University, began with the goals of academic excellence; scholarships; supporting the under-served; public policy education and participation; and community problem solving.

On April 16, 1993 Inglewood Alumnae, the 851st Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. was chartered. Members were charged with revitalizing the Inglewood community by "Reaching Back - to reclaim sorors; Going Back - to principles and traditions, and Giving Back - to the community a portion of that which was given to us."

IAC Programs and Projects

Each committee plays a significant role in the chapter's commitment to Sisterhood, Scholarship and Service. It is through these committees that the Sorority's Programs are carried out:

Arts & Letters

Arts and Letters celebrates the artistic talents of Inglewood's children, supports local artists, and exposes the community to culturally enriching experiences.

Delta Academy

The Dr. Betty L. Shabazz Delta Academy serves as a catalyst for academic excellence among African American girls ages 11-14.

Delta GEMS

The Delta Growing and Empowering Myself Successfully (GEMS) program serves as a vehicle for enhancing academic excellence in young African- American women between the ages of 14 & 18.

EMBODI

The Empowering Males to Build Opportunities to Develop Independence (EMBODI) program is designed to redirect the paths of at-risk African American males, ages 13-17.

Financial Fortitude

Financial literacy and economic empowerment are the foundation for community workshops on issues of personal finance, homeownership and long-term planning.

International Awareness & Involvement

This committee collaborates to provide resources and support to individuals and institutions working to improve the health and well-being of, and enhance educational opportunities for, people throughout the African Diaspora.

Physical & Mental Health

Focusing on the physical and mental health of its members and the Inglewood community, The Summits promotes, facilitates and disseminates strategies for healthy eating, active living, stress reduction, and increasing access to local resources.

Scholarship

The Chapter provides local area youth with guidance and resources through college preparatory forums and provides scholarships to African American female seniors living or attending schools in the City of Inglewood.

Social Action

Voter registration, education and mobilization activities are convened to ensure chapter members and community residents are aware of and able to act on local, state and national issues that impact their well-being and that of their community.
